

? Your Questions - Our Answers ?

Why can some articles from the library's research databases be downloaded only by professors or librarians? As a student, how do I get access to those articles?

What you're encountering is the library's "Elsevier Article Service." Elsevier is a highly respected scholarly publisher in the sciences, but its journals are very expensive. Rather than subscribe to only a limited number of Elsevier journals, the library subscribes to a service that provides access to all 1,800 Elsevier journals for a per article download cost of \$22. We manage the budget for this service by limiting log-in access to Calvin faculty and the librarians.

If you encounter one of these articles, please review the abstract carefully to determine its relevancy for your research. If you decide you need the article, simply contact a librarian, either in person at the 2nd floor Research Assistance Desk or via e-mail. Provide the librarian with the full article citation, and we will download it for you (usually right way, or within the day).
