### Research Databases Review!

We have 150+ research databases at Hekman Library, so where do you start? Some suggestions:

Check out our Databases by Subject tool (Library home-page > Quick Links > Research Databases) which presents the top 2-3 recommended databases for academic subject areas. Or, try two popular interdisciplinary databases: JSTOR and Academic OneFile.

JSTOR is an all full-text database of scholarly, peer-reviewed journals mostly in the humanities and social sciences. Full-text for each journal begins with the first volume, with coverage ending for many titles 3-5 years ago, although a growing number of journals now have coverage up to the present.



Academic OneFile also covers mostly full-text peer-reviewed journal articles, as well as popular magazine and news sources. Subjects covered include the sciences, medicine, technology, social sciences, and humanities.

Tip: For an interdisciplinary, scholarly database that is more oriented to the sciences, try Web of Knowledge.

### How does Full-Text @ Hekman work?

Search our research databases and you will often come across this  Full-Text @ Hekman icon next to item citations:

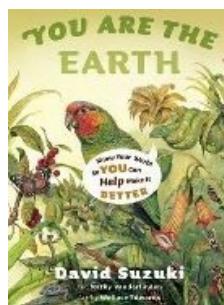
The Full-Text @ Hekman service works by checking the Hekman Library holdings to determine if we have local access, either print or online. By clicking on that icon, you will be presented with full-text options for the item; if we do not have print or online access for it, there will be a link for requesting it through interlibrary loan (ILL).

### Special Collection Spotlight: Curriculum Center

The Curriculum Center is a collection of PreK-12 instructional resources, used primarily by students and faculty in Calvin's Teacher Education program. It is located outside the library in the lower level of Hiemenga Hall (Rms. 211-220). The collection includes textbooks, magazines, software, video and DVDs, games and activities, as well as posters and maps. They even have a puppet collection!

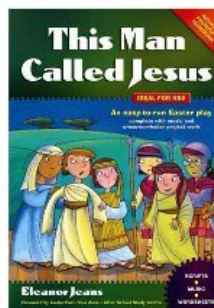
